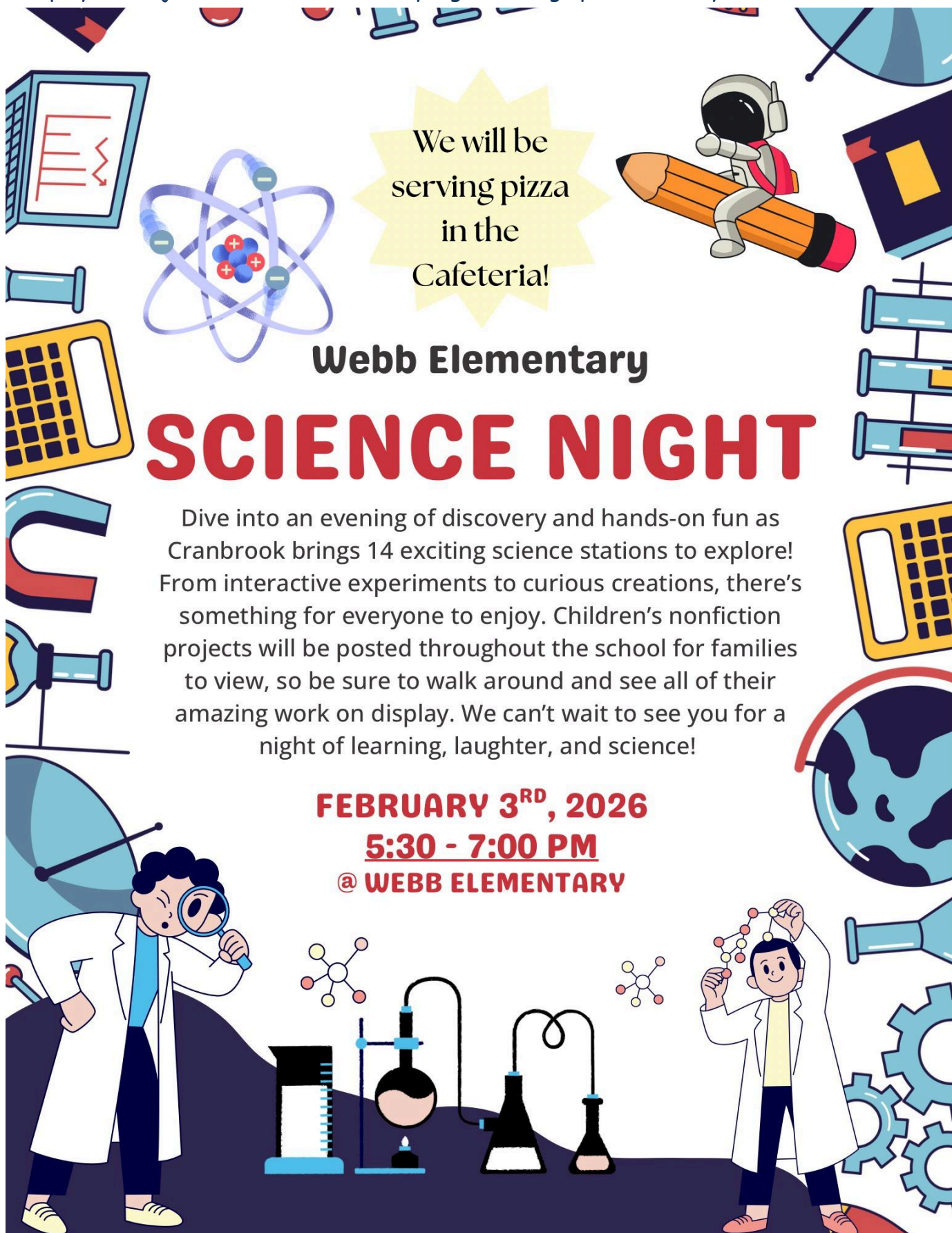
SCIENCE NIGHT

Reading and Testing Information

On Friday all students will come home with the testing results from math and reading I-Ready testing as well as information on your child's reading progress and current reading level. There is some useful information included that will give you valuable information that could be used to support your child at home. We hope you will take some time to look over this important information.

Reading Meetings

On Tuesday we will host reading meetings for families of students that did not meet their at home reading goal this quarter. Invitations were sent home last week with students who qualify. If a family member shows up for a student, they can get a golden ticket for their child to attend the reading party this week. If a family member attended last quarter and the student did not reach their goal this quarter, then a golden ticket cannot be earned.

Bagels

Bagels are for sale on Wednesdays for \$1.25 each. We offer salt, plain, cinnamon raisin & onion. Students who are late will NOT be allowed to buy a bagel unless they have a doctor's note for their tardiness.

Fundraiser

On Monday we will kick off our annual school fundraiser. In the past we have had a chocolate candy fundraiser with an Easter theme, but we are going to try something different this year. This year we are going to sell Garden Fresh Chips & Salsa for \$5 each throughout the month of February. As always, there will be prizes for different levels of winners. All of the information will come home from school with your child on Monday. All proceeds from this sale will support classroom libraries and other classroom needs.

School Closings

As we get through this crazy winter there may be other times when school has to close. Please continue to check email, voice messages, social media and our district website for updates about any further closings. While our goal is to stay open and have students at school, our central office tries to make decisions as early as possible to let families know in advance to arrange for care. Please keep in mind that the staff at Webb finds out about closings when the rest of the community finds out. We also want to remind you that it is very important for our students to attend school when it is open.

Cold Weather

We try to go out for recess as much as possible so the students get some fresh air and exercise. The cutoff temperature is 20 degrees with wind chill factored in. Please make sure that your child brings appropriate gear to school to keep them warm during outside recess. If there is snow on the ground the students will ONLY be allowed to play on the playground if they have winter boots on. If they don't have boots they must stay on the sidewalk area. We do have some donated winter items if your child is in need - reach out to the school office to see if we have any items that would fit.
