

## School Closings

As you know, school has been closed for today due to the weather. It is supposed to be another very cold week ahead. Please continue to check email, voice messages, social media and our district website for updates about any further closings. While our goal is to stay open and have students at school, our central office tries to make decisions as early as possible to let families know in advance to arrange for care. However, it is very important for our students to attend school when it is open.

## Cold Weather

We try to go out for recess as much as possible so the students get some fresh air and exercise. The cutoff temperature is 20 degrees with wind chill factored in. Please make sure that your child brings appropriate gear to school to keep them warm during outside recess. If there is snow on the ground the students will ONLY be allowed to play on the playground if they have winter boots on. If they don't have boots they must stay on the sidewalk area. We do have some donated winter items if your child is in need - reach out to the school office to see if we have any items that would fit.

## Reading Rewards

This week we will have our reading rewards for our students who are consistently doing their at home reading. It is critical that your child is doing this important work of reading at home for 30 minutes every night. This work is critical to their growth as readers.

## Report Cards

Report Cards will go home with students on Wednesday. Please keep in mind that there is a new format for report cards. They are based on grade level standards. When you see standards that do not have a number, that means that standard was not taught or assessed this quarter but will be taught later on during the year. The students are given numbers to show their current progress:

- 4=Student working above grade level expectations
- 3=Student meeting grade level expectations
- 2=Student approaching but not meeting grade level expectations
- 1=Not meeting grade level expectations

Next week, we will also be sending home reports regarding your child's reading level and how you can help them at home (IRLA Report) as well as information about their reading and math achievement according the I-Ready assessments we give 3 times per year. Students in grades K-3 will receive IRIP reports that discuss reading progress and needs. Please let your child's teacher know if you have any questions. ## LET'S REVIEW!

As December came to an end, we finished our very first unit, Internet Safety! We reviewed what it meant to have a healthy relationship with our devices, how to use our devices in school, and ways to stay safe online. Now we have a great understanding of expectations with our devices in STEAM, so we can move on to using them in our new unit.



## NEW YEAR, NEW GOALS!

As the New Year rolls in, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade came into STEAM ready to set some typing goals! Students took three typing tests, where they recorded their WPM (Words Per Minute) and then put their math skills to the test. Once recording all their scores they added them up, then divided by three to find their average. Our goal is to grow at least five words per minute from our current average!



## UNIT 2: CODING

On Monday we began our new coding unit, this is something the students have been so excited about and they are eager to learn more! We explored questions we want to answer with this new start:

- What is coding?
- What is code?
- What is a program?
- What do programmers do?



## WHERE WE'RE STARTING


- 5 In 5<sup>th</sup> grade, we started off the conversation about AI, what it is, examples of it in our lives and how we interact with it.
- 4 In 4<sup>th</sup> grade, our main question to figure out was: What exactly is code? We came to the conclusion that code is the language that computers speak, programmers write a set of specific instructions for a computer to follow in code; known as a program.
- 3 In 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, we talked about how when programmers write a program they need to be super specific! If they're not, the computer won't know what to do - you must teach it! We walked through how many steps there is in making a PB + J, but what they didn't realize is just how many steps there is! You have to open jars, get materials, and you can't forget to clean up!

Our younger students took their first shot at being programmers, and programmed their robot teacher Ms. Webb! Students had to work together to come up with specific instructions for how they could make me go to the whiteboard and draw a smiley face.






